			Outwith Core Hours Information Wigtown Festival Company has a licence to play background music in the shop where alcohol will be sold. Occasional meetings and small events may also take place on the premises - mostly in another part of the building but occasionally within the shop/licensed area. Any other activities The primary purpose of the shop premises is the sale of books for the Wigtown Festival Company (WFC), and the sale of tickets and merchandise for the various festivals and events organised by the WFC annually. <u>Capacity</u> 2.4m²
